Here are some Sheriff's "Quick Tips" for Home Security:

- Lock all doors and windows when you are away, even if you are gone for a short period of time. Leave the radio or television on when you are out. Timers for televisions, lights and radios can be used when you are gone for longer periods of time!
- If you have an alarm, use it! When you don't set the alarm is when you will be burglarized!
- Install exterior lights using wattage sufficient to see someone at 25 ft on the perimeter of your house. Sensor lights or dusk to dawn lights are excellent for this!
- Trim trees and shrubs around your home to eliminate potential hiding places for burglars.
- Get to know your neighbors and let them know when you are going to be away for extended periods of time. Have your neighbor pick up your mail and newspapers so it is not obvious you are away. Park a neighbor's car in your driveway so it appears someone is home!
- Notify your Sheriff's Office when you are going on vacation and set up a Residential Vacation Check by patrol deputies.
- Be aware of what is going on in your neighborhood. Phone your Sheriff's Office and report strange cars or persons in your neighborhood!
- Operation Identification—Mark your property with an electric engraver using your California Drivers License or Identification number. The engraver is available through the Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Support.



YOUR PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION LIST



1 For permanent identification of your possessions, use an engraver to mark your Driver's License, you should consider getting a Non-Driver's Identification Card from the Department of Motor Vehicles. Avoid marking on removable parts such as lids, plates, doors, etc. Engrave the numbers as clearly and as close together as possible. Use this form to list your valuables along with their description and where you have them engraved.



There are some things you may not want to engrave such as antiques, jewelry, furs, watches, etc. Anything that could be damaged by engraving should be photographed. Write a short description of the item on the back of each photo. Keep it and this property list in a safe place. If anything is stolen, you will have a detailed description, along with photographs of the things that were not marked, to give to law enforcement.

Place warning stickers on your exterior doors and window. Permanently mark your valuable with your California Driver's License number, prefaced by CA and ending with DL. If you do not have a Driver's License, use a Non-Driver's Identification Card number.
